National Library Week April 6-12



Millions of people across the country visit their libraries every week. What's the draw? Everything. Make your mark and get involved with your library by volunteering or spreading the word. Whatever draws you in, the library has something for everyone!

We're celebrating National Library Week with Food For Fines.

This is a fantastic opportunity for patrons to simultaneously pay down library fines while giving back to the community. Food items will be collected at both Community Library branches during the week of April 6. Donations made will go to The Sharing Center in Trevor and the Twin Lakes Area Food Pantry.

About National Library Week

National Library Week is an annual celebration highlighting the valuable role libraries, librarians, and library workers play in transforming lives and strengthening our communities.

In the mid-1950s, research showed that Americans were spending less on books and more on radios, televisions and musical instruments. Concerned that Americans were reading less, the ALA and the American Book Publishers formed a nonprofit citizens organization called the National Book Committee in 1954. The committee's goals were ambitious. They ranged from "encouraging people to read in their increasing leisure time" to "improving incomes and health" and "developing strong and happy family life."

In 1957, the committee developed a plan for National Library Week based on the idea that once people were motivated to read, they would support and use libraries. With the cooperation of ALA and with help from the Advertising Council, the first National Library Week was observed in 1958 with the theme "Wake Up and Read!" The 2025 celebration marks the 67th anniversary of the first event.
